5 FAVOURITE SIGHTINGS

GALAGOS

These small nocturnal primates acquired the name 'bushbaby' because their call resembles a small baby crying. They feed on grasshoppers and sometimes bird's eggs. To mark their territory, they urinate on their hands and jump from tree to tree.

WILD DOGS

Living in packs of 10-30, usually dominated by a monogamous breeding pair, wild dogs are successful hunters, chasing their prey over long distances, and are very social, sharing food or regurgitating it for others.

LEOPARDS

You never tire of seeing leopards. Even if you come across two or three, you will still see different behaviour. They are powerful, opportunistic hunters who will feed on anything they come across, from lizards to antelopes.

TERMITE MOUNDS

Built by termites using saliva, faeces and clay, the mounds comprise a series of tunnels for airflow and travelling when foraging for food. The nest is deeply located within the structure. The queen is well protected by the soldiers, while the workers build the chamber.

DUNG BEETLES

Guests love watching these beetles, which use dung as a food source or breeding chamber. They are known as rollers, tunnellers, dwellers or stealers, depending on how they use the dung. 🐾
