# INTERNATIONAL TRAVELLERS



## QUARANTINE EXEMPTION

### *“Which travellers have to quarantine on arrival?”*

- Passengers/nationals travelling from the countries appearing in this Kenya Civil Aviation Authorities-issued listing [HERE](https://www.kcaa.or.ke/sites/default/files/docs/covid_19/exempted_states.pdf), ([https://www.kcaa.or.ke/sites/default/files/docs/covid\\_19/exempted\\_states.pdf](https://www.kcaa.or.ke/sites/default/files/docs/covid_19/exempted_states.pdf)), who, on arrival:
  - ~ **do NOT have a temperature** above 37.5°C (99.5°F);
  - ~ are **NOT exhibiting typical COVID-19 symptoms**;
  - ~ are **in possession of a COVID-19 negative certificate** (dated no later than 96 hours earlier on arrival into Kenya);**will NOT face mandatory quarantine.**
- Travellers arriving from countries NOT appearing on the “exempt countries” list **will NOT be exempt** and **WILL be required to quarantine upon arrival** either at Government of Kenya-designated facility or at a Kenyan residence **for 14 days**. Those taken into government quarantine will not be charged a fee for their stay at the facility.
- **Note this information is changing on daily basis.** Further updates affecting newly-exempted countries and other travel changes will be issued as and when they arise and these can be accessed on **the KCAA website [HERE](https://www.kcaa.or.ke/sites/default/files/docs/covid_19/exempted_states.pdf)**, or via the below link:

### ✓ **Negative PCR Covid-19 Test Certificate**

*dated no older than 96 hours before arrival into Kenya*

- All arriving passengers on international flights must show a **negative COVID-19 PCR test** certificate on arrival.
- Certificates must be dated **no older than 96 hours before** arrival time into Kenya and have been **verified** by the online global **Trusted Travel (TT) Initiative** (*see next slide*).
- However, each airline has its own rules and regulations concerning 'Fit-to-Fly' COVID-19 Certificate issuing and travellers should consult their airline ahead of travel.

### ✓ **Online E-Visa Application**

- **Online visa applications** ahead of travel **are now mandatory** for all travellers (adults and children) from applicable countries.
- **Visas on arrival are no longer available** in an attempt to reduce the handling of paperwork, cash and to improve security.
- Travellers should visit the [www.evisa.go.ke](http://www.evisa.go.ke) portal to apply for an eVisa when planning their travel.

### ✓ **Trusted Travel (TT) Initiative QR Code**

Kenya has implemented an online verification process of COVID-19 PCR test results – **the Trusted Travel (TT) initiative** – and it is now a requirement for **all inbound travellers into Kenya.**

### *“How does TT work?”*

Upon receiving a negative COVID-19 PCR test result from an authorised laboratory, a traveller is then issued with a **‘Trusted Travel Code’** (a QR code) that can be verified by the airlines and Port Health Officials.

1. The traveller will receive an SMS/text from PanaBIOS ([www.panabios.org](http://www.panabios.org)) and an email from the testing laboratory (and/or from [admin@panabios.org](mailto:admin@panabios.org)) with a link to generate their travel code at [trustedtravel.panabios.org](http://trustedtravel.panabios.org)
2. Travellers from countries that haven't implemented the Trusted Travel (TT) Initiative can use a tool provided by the UNDP-supported Global Haven Partnership ([www.globalhaven.org](http://www.globalhaven.org)) to authenticate their PCR test results.

### ✓ Online “Travellers Health Surveillance Form” for International Travellers

- All travellers entering Kenya are **required to complete a “Travellers Health Surveillance” form on arrival**. The **Travellers Health Surveillance Form** as completed by arriving international visitors to Kenya monitors movement into the country. (*note it does not geo-track a travellers’ location*).
- The form requests a flight seat number so this can be completed, **after online check-in** when a seat number has been issued. As a result, you will be encourage by airline staff not to change your seat during your journey.
- **On arrival**, passengers can also complete the form online if they have access to the internet.
- When completed/submitted online, a QR code is then sent to the email appearing on the form, which the passenger will be obliged to show to the Port Health Official in Arrivals (a print-out or on a device).
- If passengers do not have access to the online form to complete, **a hard copy of the form can be completed** and handed to the Official – and these are available on board the aircraft or on arrival.

## MANDATORY ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. **Negative PCR Covid-19 Test Certificate – <96 hours' old**
2. **Trusted Traveller Certificate QR Code**
3. **Travellers Health Surveillance Form QR Code**

- If on arrival, travellers are NOT exhibiting typical COVID-19 symptoms:
  - ~ *temperature above 37.5°C (99.5°F)*
  - ~ *persistent cough*
  - ~ *difficulty in breathing*
  - ~ *flu-like symptoms*they will be exempt from quarantine.
- All arriving passengers on international flights must show:
  - ✓ **a negative COVID-19 PCR test certificate** – no older <96 hours' than arrival date & time into Kenya
  - ✓ **Trusted Travel (TT) QR code** – generated from online verification of negative Covid-19 PCR test certificate *(we also recommend printing a hard copy of this code in case you can't access the digital version on arrival)*
  - ✓ **Traveller Health Surveillance QR code** the traveller receives once he/she completed the online Traveller Health Surveillance Form and was issued with a QR code to present *(we also recommend printing a hard copy of this code in case you can't access the digital version on arrival)*



**NEW Travel requirement for both Domestic & International passengers travelling IN & OUT OF KENYA'S DOMESTIC "PORTS"**

## ✓ Online “Local Travellers Health Surveillance Form” – Domestic & International Travellers

There is a new mandatory requirement for passengers travelling IN and/or OUT of Kenya’s domestic airports/ports, including Wilson airport (*effective 21<sup>st</sup> June 2021*).\*

- Passengers **travelling INTO and/or OUT** of Kenya’s domestic airports & ports – **International AND domestic travellers** – must now fill out an online “**Local Travellers Health Surveillance Form**” which monitors movement within the country, concerning Covid-19.
- However, **each airline has its own requirements** - agents or passengers should take care to familiarize themselves with the exact action that needs to be taken and when, according to their airline of travel. - The following slides outline the requirements for the below domestic airlines:

  - Safarilink
  - Governors’ Aviation

\* **Note this is not currently being strictly enforced for every single arriving/departing passenger, so travellers should not be alarmed if they have a QR code ready to share with the official, but are not asked for it. However, we still encourage all travellers to complete the online form as required to avoid delay to their journey.**

## ✓ Online “Local Travellers Health Surveillance Form” – Domestic & International Travellers

### “Who needs to complete the form?”

- All ARRIVING / INBOUND passengers travelling on an **AirKenya flight** INTO **Wilson Airport** FROM a **bush destination** must complete the “**Local Travellers Health Surveillance**” form **24 hours prior to their arrival** into the airport.
- Therefore a form must be completed for each “leg” and submitted in the below scenarios:
  1. Passengers travelling **on AirKenya** TO Wilson Airport returning **FROM** the Masai Mara or Samburu
  2. Passengers travelling **on AirKenya** to Wilson Airport **IN TRANSIT FROM** the bush destinations transiting onto other bush destinations – i.e. *from Kalama airstrip (servicing Saruni Samburu & Saruni Rhino) to Mara North airstrip (servicing Saruni Mara & Saruni Wild) **going VIA Wilson Airport.***

*In the above example:*

    - **1 x form** should be completed in advance for **the Samburu to Wilson leg**
    - **a 2<sup>nd</sup> form** should be completed for the **Mara North leg back to Wilson Airport / other major “port”.**

## “Who needs to complete the form?” CONTINUED

- It is also a requirement even when **in transit FROM** Kilimanjaro en route **TO** the bush destinations and INTO Kisumu airport FROM safari destinations (for example, Mara or Samburu).
- This also applies to all **INBOUND passengers** arriving at **Kisumu airport** from Entebbe (Uganda).

A form **MUST** be filled out **for every arrival at each new domestic “port”**  
(i.e. entry/exit port that has a Kenya Airport Authority health office – so not the bush airstrips nor Nanyuki)

**Note:** AirKenya staff are on hand to assist with passengers who have not managed to complete the form in advance, or, who have faced difficulties in doing so. Passengers will be able to complete the form online accessing the internet in the AirKenya arrivals lounge at Wilson airport. However, this will cause delay to the journey and forms should be completed 24-hour in advance ahead of arriving at the airport whenever possible.

# Safarilink

## ✓ Online “Local Travellers Health Surveillance Form” – Domestic & International Travellers

*“Who needs to complete the form?”*

All passengers travelling on a **Safarilink** flight:

1. **INTO** Wilson Airport **FROM** a bush destination;
2. **IN & OUT** of Wilson Airport to the below destinations:
  - ~ Kisumu
  - ~ Malindi
  - ~ Diani
  - ~ Vipingo

must complete the **“Local Travellers Health Surveillance”** form **24 hours prior to their arrival** into the airport.

Therefore a form must be completed for each “leg” and submitted in the below scenarios:

1. Passengers travelling **on Safarilink TO** Wilson Airport returning **FROM** all destinations
2. Passengers travelling **on Safarilink** to Wilson Airport **IN TRANSIT FROM** the bush destinations transiting onto other destinations – i.e. *from Kalama airstrip (servicing Saruni Samburu & Saruni Rhino) to Mara North airstrip (servicing Saruni Mara & Saruni Wild) going VIA Wilson Airport.*

*In the above example:*

- **1 x form** should be completed in advance for **the Samburu to Wilson leg**
- **a 2<sup>nd</sup> form** should be completed for the **Mara North leg back to Wilson Airport / other major “port”.**

3. Passengers travelling **on Safarilink OUT OF** Wilson Airport to the above listed non-bush destinations.

## ✓ Online “Local Travellers Health Surveillance Form” – Domestic & International Travellers

A form MUST be filled out **for every arrival at each new domestic “port”**  
(i.e. entry/exit port that has a Kenya Airport Authority health office – so not the bush airstrips nor Nanyuki)

**Note:** Safarilink staff are on hand to assist with passengers who have not managed to complete the form in advance, or, who have faced difficulties in doing so. Passengers will be able to complete the form online accessing the internet in the Safarilink arrivals lounge at Wilson airport. However, this will cause delay to the journey and forms should be completed 24-hour in advance ahead of arriving at the airport whenever possible.

***“Who needs to complete the form?”***

- All passengers **IN & OUT OF** Wilson Airport, travelling on **ANY Governors' Aviation flight** to **ALL DESTINATIONS MUST** complete the ***“Local Travellers Health Surveillance”*** form **24 hours prior to their arrival** at or into the airport.

A form **MUST** be filled out **for every arrival at each new domestic “port”**

*(i.e. entry/exit port that has a Kenya Airport Authority health office – so not the bush airstrips nor Nanyuki)*

**Note:** Governors' Aviation staff are on hand to assist with passengers who have not managed to complete the form in advance, or, who have faced difficulties in doing so. Passengers will be able to complete the form online accessing the internet in the Governors' Aviation arrivals lounge at Wilson airport. However, this will cause delay to the journey and forms should be completed 24-hour in advance ahead of arriving at the airport whenever possible.

## ✓ Online “Local Travellers Health Surveillance Form” – Domestic & International Travellers



### ***“How to access the form, and how does it work”?***

- The form is available via the link [https://ears.health.go.ke/local\\_airline\\_registration/](https://ears.health.go.ke/local_airline_registration/) or the *Jitenge* App (available on Google Playstore).
- Once the online form is submitted, passengers will then receive a **QR code to the email address they indicated on the form** that they will then present to the port health official at the KAA arrivals terminal **for clearance to exit the airport.**
- We also recommend printing a hard copy of the QR code or taking a screen grab, in case travellers can't access the digital version when requested to do so.

## Instructions

- iPhone users should use Chrome or Firefox web browser when accessing the form link:  
[http://ears.health.go.ke/local\\_airline\\_registration/](http://ears.health.go.ke/local_airline_registration/)
- If using the Jitenge App (*accessible by Android users only*) a login in page will appear requiring travellers to sign up for an account. Among the four options that will appear, travellers are instructed to select **the ‘air travellers’** option.
- **All the mandatory fields starred in red must be filled.** Upon submission, a QR code will be sent to the traveller's email address. **NOTE: Fill in the “date of arrival in Kenya” as the date of arrival at the domestic airport (i.e. NBO Wilson).**
- **iPhone users** unable to access their QR code via email should check their system’s download folder or present their telephone number, and passport number/ID at the port health desk to retrieve the QR code.
- **Android users** unable to access their QR code via email can log in to their accounts via the Jitenge App and input the telephone number they used during registration as well as their Passport/ID number. Select the QR code that pops up in their name, screenshot and present at the Health desk.

**NEW Travel requirement for both Domestic & International passengers travelling IN & OUT OF KENYA DOMESTIC “PORTS”**

- ✓ **CONTINUED: Online “Local Travellers Health Surveillance Form” – Domestic & International Travellers**
- **International travellers** therefore are currently required to complete **2 x “Travellers Health Surveillance Forms”** – one for entry into Kenya, and one for movement within Kenya:
  1. **Before arriving into Kenya** - complete online form - [https://ears.health.go.ke/airline\\_registration/](https://ears.health.go.ke/airline_registration/)
  2. **24 hours before** arriving at the local airport/port - complete online form - [http://ears.health.go.ke/local\\_airline\\_registration/](http://ears.health.go.ke/local_airline_registration/)

## **IMPORTANT TO NOTE:**

- **1 x form to be completed for each adult travelling.**
- Travellers can fill out the forms in advance, but the dates on the form must correspond with the arrival date into each domestic port. (AirKenya), or the departure and/or the arrival date out of each domestic port. (Safarilink & Governors’ Aviation).
- International travellers should fill in the address of the first hotel they stay in Kenya, excluding Nairobi, in both the permanent and temporal residence fields.
- All fields marked with an \* are mandatory and must be completed in order to successfully submit the form.
- Passengers do not need to “scan” the QR code, it is to be presented to port health officials on arrival at all domestic ports for clearance.
- *With this information, the government of Kenya can track any infected persons and those exposed while in transit via air.*

**\*\*COVID-19 PCR Testing is available across all Saruni properties\*\***

**For departing travellers, please be aware that this process only applies for onward destinations that require a negative Covid-19 PCR Test Certificate.**

- An in-camp testing service is available at Saruni Samburu, Saruni Mara & Saruni Wild and costs US\$140 per person. This avoids guests having to cut a safari short by a night in order to conduct the tests in Nairobi.
- Guests staying at Saruni Rhino only and requiring a test can arrange to have it done at nearby Saruni Samburu.
- Testing is done by authorised TTI laboratories and is usually done between 24-48 hours before departure from Kenya to ensure results are returned in time.
- However, the traveller or the agent on behalf of their client should check the requirements of the traveller's onward destinations/returning countries for how many hours/days beforehand the should test should be taken to remain valid on arrival/return. They should advise us of this requirement at the time of requesting the Covid testing as part of the safari itinerary.

1. # INTERNATIONAL TRAVELLERS



## BEFORE DEPARTING FROM KENYA

- All departing passengers from Kenya must show:
  - ✓ a **negative COVID-19 PCR test certificate** (*with a valid test date as per specific onward destination/returning country*);
  - ✓ **Trusted Travel (TT) code (QR code)** – generated from online verification of negative Covid-19 PCR test certificate;
  - ✓ Documentation relating to specific entry requirements for transit and/or destination country/ies.
